😻 Swaffham Town – History in Brief

The club itself was founded in 1892 and had a rather successful start getting to the final of the Norfolk Junior Cup two years later, the club continued through the years until its next highpoint in 1951-1952 where the Junior Cup home was bought home after winning it for two consecutive years, capping off the historical era of the club on a high.

The modern era of the club as we know it today started back in 1959 where club legends such as Bob Tuttle, Albert Hudson and Gurney Titmarsh amongst others, purchased the land on behalf of the club for as little as £250.00.

Swaffham Town Football Club has been built and is continued to be looked after by dedicated local family volunteers, who live in the town and surrounding villages and it's safe to say we are proud of the legacy left behind of those still with us and those who unfortunately are not.

The original club house itself was located further up the pitch and was a relatively small building containing changing rooms and a tiny area to have a tea after the match.

I'm told one of the standout memories of the old club house was the communal team bath that took the whole game to fill up. As time passed the club grew and it was decided to relocate the clubhouse to its position today, at the bottom of the infamous slope.

This took place after the late 60's and into the 70's and the works were again completed by local families such as the Leadbetters, Tutle's, Palmer's, Hudson's, Ward's and the Titmarsh's and it's safe to safe that they did a fantastic job.

The club joined the Anglian Combination and won Division Two in 1973-74. In 1990 they were promoted to Division One of the Eastern Counties League. After winning the division in 2001–02 they were promoted to the Premier Division.

However, they finished bottom of the Premier Division in their first season, and were relegated back to Division One.

The club remained in Division One until the end of the 2014–15 season, when they were promoted after finishing as runners-up.

The club progressed throughout the coming years and became the stable senior outfit it is today, drifting between the two divisions in the then Jewson league and the Thurlow Nunn league as it is known to date under managers such as Lucian Hodkinson and Paul Hunt.

Throughout those years' memorable characters such as, Jock, Stuart Seales, David Leadbetter, Mark Blockwell and David Spalding have put on the famous black and white stripes.

In 2016–17 Swaffham finished bottom of the Premier Division, and were relegated to Division One.

They were moved to Division One North as part of league reorganisation in 2018, and went on to win the Division One North title in 2018-19, earning promotion back to the Premier Division.

In the 2021/22 season the club struggled once again and finished bottom of the Premier Division and were relegated back to the Division one North.

The 2022/23 season saw them finish in 14th place, winning 9 off their league matches and the following season they finished they finished 3rd from bottom and in a relegation place but with other teams withdrawing from the league and the FA re-structuring we maintain our place in the Division One North.

A Few Lines On The F.A. Vase

The FA Vase effectively replaced The FA Amateur Cup in 1974.

In that year The FA Council had decided to abolish the official distinction between amateur and professional footballers and this meant the end of The Amateur Cup and Amateur Internationals involving England.

In its first season 220 clubs entered, but they did not include those that had dominated in The Amateur Cup. Enfield, Hendon, Dagenham, Skelmersdale United and others at their level were immediately allocated to The FA Trophy.

For the first time in history, small clubs – even village clubs – had the chance of playing in a national final at Wembley.

The first Vase finalists were Hoddesdon Town from the Spartan League and Epsom & Ewell from the Surrey Senior League. The Hertfordshire side edged home 2-1 before a crowd of 9,000.

Even a competition as democratic as The Vase had its elite clubs in the early years. Billericay Town, initially of the Essex Senior League, won it three times in four seasons. Halesowen Town, then in the West Midlands Regional League, appeared in three Finals and were successful in two. They even beat a Southall side that had a young Les Ferdinand leading the attack.

Until the new Wembley opened in 2007 the record attendance for a Vase Final was the 26,489 who saw the drawn 1989 Final between Sudbury Town and Tamworth at the old Wembley. Tamworth won the replay 3-0 at Peterborough and Ian Moores, a former Division One player with Tottenham Hotspur, scored one of the goals.

The 2013-14 Vase competition was the 40th in history. Wembley had hosted 34 Finals, Villa Park and St Andrews two each, Upton Park and White Hart Lane one each. Thirty-two different clubs have got their hands on The Vase, donated by former FA Councillor Frank Adams. Whitley Bay lead the way with four wins.

Aficionados of The Vase competition tend to rate the 1992 Final between Wimborne Town and Guiseley as the best so far. Wessex League Wimborne had a modest record in the competition before then, having never ventured beyond the third round, but they embarked on a spectacular journey that took them all the way from the first round to the Final. A goal down after 14 minutes at Wembley, the Dorset side fought back to win 5-3.

When The Vase Final returned to Wembley, a record 36,232 fans saw Truro City beat AFC Totton 3-1. Whitley Bay, the 2002 winners, achieved a sensational hat-trick of Final victories from 2009 to 2011.

The Northern League's dominance continued for two more seasons, with success for Dunston UTS and Spennymoor Town before Sholing, then Wessex League champions, got their name engraved. North Shields then came from behind to win the first Final to go to extra time since 2001-02.

In 2015-16 Wembley Stadium staged the first Non-League Finals Day, which saw both the Vase and the Trophy decided back-to-back in front of almost 47,000 fans. Morpeth Town came from behind to stun Hereford 4-1 with 45-year-old Chris Swailes on the scoresheet to win the Vase with a third different club.

The 2024 winners were Romford, who beat Great Wakering Rovers 3–0 at Wembley Stadium.

Thetford Town 6 v 1 Cornard United Report by James Redman - 14th September 2024 Thurlow Nunn Premier Division Attendance - 150

Thetford Town: Smith - 15', Gilchrist - 18' & 31', King - 42', Diggens - 45' & Gilchrist - 48' Cornard United: Hughes - 53'

This Saturday afternoon saw Thetford Town host the newly promoted Cornard United.

Cornard having had a tricky start to the season, securing 7 points from 7 games so far, however they did beat high flying Fakenham Town 3-0 in the FA Cup, and Stowmarket Town 5-1 away from home, also in the FA Cup, therefore they can be a dangerous side when they turn it on. Thetford Town sat 3rd before kick-off, but having played more games than a lot of teams below them, this looks an artificial position for now, therefore 3-points were vital to keep the pressure on at the top.

It was a cool yet sunny and still afternoon, once again perfect footballing weather, with the Mundford Road grass looking in great condition, one of the best in the league for sure.

Before the game, chairman Nigel Armes thanked PES Consultancy who had kindly donated goal-keeping gloves to the club, followed by an introduction to a cohort of ex-Thetford Town players who were at the game today.

In front of what was a decent sized crowd, Thetford Town lined up in their claret and blue, with Cornard United in a blue strip.

KEY MOMENTS

TT = Thetford Town CU = Cornard United

8' - TT - Cornard keeper Kellett-Green travels out to collect ball on the far back left edge of the box, he fumbles under-pressure and Diggens pounces on the ball, from a narrow angle he flashes in a shot, a sliding block from a Cornard defender turns the ball out for a corner.

12' - TT - Quick break, Gilchrist slots Diggens through, coming in off the right, his shot from just outside the box is pulled, but deflects off a defender for a corner.

14' - TT - King sends Diggens down the right, he takes the ball to the byline and chips the ball over Kellet-Green and to the far-post, the oncoming Gilchrist volleys from point-blank range, but the effort is blocked off the line, excellent move from Thetford, winding up nicely into this game.

15' - TT - GOAL (1-0) - Thetford finally get the deserved opening goal, an incisive pass from King splits the Cornard defence and sends Elliot Smith through on goal, and he makes no mistake to calmly slot the ball in, neat well worked goal from Thetford.

18' - TT - GOAL (2-0) - A quick-fire second from Thetford, amazing interplay between Gilchrist and Diggens inside the box, a 1-2 with first touch passes, and Gilchrist finishes the move, sliding the ball into the net, great skills on show for that one!

22' - TT - Another swift move, King shuffles the ball out to Diggens down the right, he takes the ball into the box and gets past the first defender, but finding himself surrounded he manages to square the ball into King who blasts wide from close range, everyone was expecting that one to go in!

29['] - CU - Big chance for the visitors to peg one back, a throw-in goes to Louie Arnold on the byline, he manages to step past the defender and square the ball into the box, Berkane is open but fires his effort harmlessly over the bar, should have done better.

31' - TT - GOAL (3-0) - After the goal-scare, Thetford in clinical fashion fire in a 3rd to give them a bit of a cushion. In another fast attack, a slide rule pass from King puts Gilchrist through down the left, he takes the ball into the box and from a narrow angle he manages to steer is past Kellett-Green, brilliant finish.

42' - TT - GOAL (4-0) - Fantastic goal from King. He starts off the move, a short corner to Gilchrist, Gilchrist waits for the run of King and fending off the defender slots him through, King charges into the box and powers the ball full-force into the roof of the net, never gets old watching Cameron King score goals like that!

45' - TT - GOAL (5-0) - Thetford find the time to net an unbelievable 5th before the break. From the left, Laker whips a ball across goal, coming in from the right, Diggens hits a first time volley, the connection is sweet and the ball beats Kellett-Green at his near post, what a cross and what a hit, sublime.

45'+1' - TT - Just before the break, King plays Gilchrist through, but his effort is saved, no first half hattrick for the Thetford Town striker, but a corner secured.

48' - TT - GOAL (6-0) - Shortly after the break, Gilchrist finally gets his hattrick! A perfect ball over from Money picks out Gilchrist, the timing of the run is perfect and he strides through alone, rounding Kellett-Green and taping the ball into the open net, fine performance from Dan and well deserved.

53' - CU - GOAL (6-1) - Cornard peg one back, good corner from substitute Lindoe, who looked sharp when he came on, the ball swings into the far-post, Thetford fail to deal with it and Hughes smashes home from close range.

61' - CU - Louie Arnold hits a vicious shot from outside the box, Dickerson gets his fingertips to the ball, enough to push it onto the crossbar and out!

65' - TT - King shrugs off a late challenge and plays Gilchrist through, just as he shoots, Hughes gets across to make a fine block, the ball spinning out for a corner.

67' - CU - Deep cross from Cornard, Berkane is open in the middle but only manages to guide his header straight at Dickerson for a comfortable save.

90' - TT - Laker has a crack from 25yrds, it is hit well and dipping causing Kellett-Green to spill, it falls to Thetford captain Sam Bond on the left, he tries to beat the keeper at his near post, but the side-footed effort is just the wrong side of the woodwork, such a shame, would have been great to see Bondy bag a goal!

That was not how I was expecting that one to go, an unreal first-half performance from Thetford Town saw them completely blow away their opposition with fast, skilful and accurate attacking play that they could simply not compete with. The range and quality of the goals was unbelievable, was a real joy to watch, absolute bargain for only £5 today!

The team has a nice shape and balance at the moment, long may it continue. UP THE TOWN!!!

In & Around This Date In Football – 21st September

20th September 2008

Well, before the days of VAR ghost goals or phantom goals were a feature of football that caused many a discussion and argument as to whether a goal should have or shouldn't have been awarded. But if you attended the League match between Watford and Reading on 20th September 2008 there was just general amazement about the awarding of a 'goal'.. In the 13th minute of the Championship fixture Watford defender John Eustace put the ball out of play for a corner when being challenged by Reading striker Noel Hunt. But despite the ball having gone out of play yards outside the goalpost and to the astonishment of everyone in the 14,761 Vicarage Road crowd linesman Nigel Bannister flagged it as a goal. Watford protested – their manager Aidy Boothroyd was sent to the stands for protesting too much - but referee Stuart Attwell upheld the decision and a goal for Reading it was. The match ended 2-2 with that 'goal' going down as a Eustace OG.

20th September 2011

When fans of Turkish side Fenerbahçe invaded the pitch in a pre-season friendly against Ukraine's Shaktar Donetsk the Istanbul club expected to be playing behind closed doors for a while as a punishment. Instead the Turkish FA ordered that a match be played with no males over the age of 12 being allowed entry. So on 20th September 2011 a crowd of 41,000 women and children were present for Fenerbahçe's League match with Manisaspor. Players from both clubs flew flowers to the fans before the match - you just can't see that happening at Millwall !! - and no crowds problems followed in the 1-1 draw.

21st September 1949

England were beaten for the first time on home soil by a foreign country. The Republic of Ireland won 2-0 at Everton's Goodison Park.

21st September 1983

Pat Jennings became the first Irishman to win 100 international caps when helping Northern Ireland to a 3-1 victory over Austria in a Euro qualifier in Belfast.

21st September 1985

Charlton Athletic beat Stoke 2-0 in front of an 8,858 crowd who witnessed the clubs' last match before a period of exile from their home ground, The Valley. Money problems, sadly. There were ground-shares with Crystal Palace and West Ham before Charlton finally returned home in 1992.

21st September 1994

Gary Lineker announced that he would be retiring from playing football after picking up a toe injury while playing for Nagoya Grampus Eight in Japan and would be joining the BBC. Not a bad couple of careers for someone whose final school report read 'Must devote less of his time to sport if he wants to be a success.'

22nd September 1971

Leeds United were once one of the top sides in Europe....honestly! When the UEFA Cup replaced the Fairs Cup at the start of the 1971/72 season UEFA invited the two clubs with the best records in the Fairs Cup to play-off for the honour of keeping the old trophy. One was Barcelona, who won the first Fairs Cup final in 1958, with the other being Leeds who had defeated Juventus to win the last Fairs Cup final in 1971. On 22nd September 1971 in front of 35,000 at the Nou Camp Leeds were beaten 2-1 by Barcelona.

22nd September 1984

In a first Division fixture at Loftus Road visiting Newcastle United were 4-0 up against QPR at half-time. It was 5-5 at the final whistle!.

22nd September 2005

Jonathan Woodgate didn't make the best of debuts for Real Madrid following his move from Newcastle – he scored an own goal and was sent off against Athletic Bilbao.

🐷 🛯 Looking Back On The Eastern Counties League

THE ECL FROM 1948 to 1958 - THE GOLDEN YEARS

Extracts taken from The Eastern Counties Football League History by Mick Blakeman

While it may not be very original to refer to football in the post-war era as 'The Golden Years', it is difficult to look back at the ECL in that period and think of it in any other terms.

In its early years, the league had faced a series of challenges and having come through with flying colours, was then ready to thrive in the boom created by the spirit of post-war optimism.

The 1948 influx of the 'A' teams of some of London's leading Football League clubs raised ECL standards both on and off the field and over the next few years, many of the formerly purely amateur clubs began to employ professionals in increasing numbers, both as players and as coaches.

Interest was at record levels and today, clubs can only look in envy at the gates on the opening day of the 1949-50 season.

Bury Town v Colchester United Reserves - attendance 1800

Chelmsford City Reserves v Arsenal 'A' - 4800

Gillingham Reserves v Chelsea 'A' - 4600

Harwich & Parkeston v Newmarket Town - 1500

Kings Lynn v Gorleston - 5300

Lowestoft Town v Ipswich Town 'A' - 4000

Tottenham Hotspurs 'A' v West Ham United 'A' - 3700

To emphasise the point further, in 1954-55 Cambridge United finished 4th in the ECL, watched by an average home attendance of 3013, a higher figure than in at least half-adozen of their later season in the Football League.

Reserves and 'A' Teams figured strongly in the list of league champions for the period but both Gorleston and Kings Lynn added their names to the roll of honour while Clacton, Cambridge United, Yarmouth, Spalding and March were amongst those whose title chances could rarely be discounted.

The number of different clubs with a chance of winning the league obviously helped the level of interest while the overall improvement in the standards of play was perhaps best demonstrated by the increase in success in the F.A. Cup.

In the 30 years immediately before the formation of the ECL, only Lowestoft, Chelmsford and Harwich (once each) had ever reached the competition Proper. In the ECL's first 6 completed seasons, between 1935 and 1948 four clubs (again once each) could claim that distinction but in the 10 seasons covered by the 'Golden Years' the league was represented in the First Round 11 times and in the Second Round, 3 times.

Both Yarmouth and Cambridge United beat Football League opposition for the first time ever and Gorleston almost did the same in a three game epic with Leyton Orient.

When you also consider that in 1953 Harwich & Parkeston played in front of a 100,000 crowd at Wembley in the F.A. Amateur Cup Final against Pegasus, it is difficult to argue with the statement that these were indeed the golden years.
